How can RPOs help strengthen and streamline the open access repositories created over the past 30 years, such as ArXiv or Hal, still work with the publishing oligopolies that control today's market, and suggest publishing alternatives? What are the next steps for preserving data in the public domain, in line with the FAIR (Findability, Accessibility, Interoperability, and Reusability) principles, endorsed by the leaders of the G20 in 2016. This discussion will cover all topics, from scientific publishing and open access, to open data and the culture shift needed to achieve true open science.</p>
